Information on Toxicological Effects

Symptoms No information available.

Delayed and immediate effects as well as chronic effects from short and long-term exposure

Severe irritation was observed on the backs of human volunteers under a 48 hr closed Skin Corrosion/Irritation

patch with 32% Geraniol in acetone. Undiluted Geraniol caused irritation in 2/25 human subjects after 4 hours in a closed patch test. 0.1 gm of undiluted Geraniol for 24 hrs on rabbits or guinea pigs caused severe irritation. Up to 20% Geraniol in petrolatum did not

produce irritation in human volunteers in 48-hour closed patch tests.

Serious eye damage/eye irritation In a study using OECD Guideline 405 "Acute Eye Irritation/Corrosion", undiluted Geraniol

caused well-defined signs of eye irritation, including cornea opacity, iris lesion, crimson red conjunctiva and swelling of the conjuctiva in rabbits. The changes were not reversible in 2/4 rabbits after an observation period of 21 days. In rabbits, 5.0% Geraniol in alcohol SDA

caused mild conjunctival irritation which was cleared by day 4.

Sensitization In a human repeated insult patch study using a modified Draize test, 10% Geraniol in

> alcohol (in both induction and challenge) gave 2/73 sensitizations, while 10% Geraniol in petrolatum resulted 0/104 sensitizations as a 10% solution. Several other repeated insult patch tests showed that 10% Geraniol in 1:3 ethanol:diethyl phthalate, or 12.5% in ethanol produced no sensitization effects in any of the subjects tested. A 6% Geraniol in petrolatum

caused no effects on Japanese American subjects in a human maximization test. Not mutagenic in AMES Test. Not clastogenic in a mouse micronucleus test.
